



Requirements for Acceptance into the Truck Driver Training Program

Students accepted in the Truck Driver Training Program must meet the requirements of the College and the United States Department of Transportation (DOT). Students must comply with all of the requirements of the DOT, including the results of a mandatory drug screen prior to admission and submission to random drug screens during enrollment. The following outlines the requirements that must be met to enter and to remain enrolled in DCCC's Truck Driver Training (TDT) program:

- Furnish a DMV seven-year driving record (must be within last 90 days) which does not contain any of the following **CONVICTIONS within the last 48 month:**
 - Driving while impaired (DWI or DUI)
 - Hit and Run
 - Careless and reckless driving
 - Refusing to take a chemical test
- Provide evidence of a current CDL class A learners permit.
- Furnish acceptable results of a DOT physical examination.
- Submit acceptable results of a DOT required drug screening.

Payment for the above items and College tuition is not refundable in the event the applicant does not meet the entry requirements of the program.

After admission to the program, students enrolled in the Davidson County Community College Truck Driver Training program will be subject to random drug and/or alcohol tests. Students who exhibit impaired job performance or impaired thinking (the inability to make appropriate judgments and/or carry out functions appropriately) or who exhibit other signs of possible use of alcohol or controlled substances will be requested to submit to a drug or alcohol test. Failure to comply with the request to submit to a controlled substance screen will be cause for dismissal from the program.
