



SaVE Act

Title IX of the Higher Education Act requires Davidson County Community College to ban discrimination on the basis of sex in its education programs and activities. The college's policy forbids discrimination based on sex, race, color, religion, age, disability or national origin.

Additionally, the new requirements under the law call for a strengthening of the Davidson County Community College policy in the prevention of sexual violence. The college has a long-standing policy against sexual harassment and sexual assault in place. Now, the updated policy includes explicit prohibition of acts of dating violence, domestic violence, sexual assault, and stalking. The College's Board of Trustees approved the complete policy, which applies to students and employees, in the summer of 2015.
